Selective Placement Factor(Military Grade): SSG-TSgt/E6 - SFC-MSgt/E7 (IAW NGR 600-5 or AFI 36-101, grade inversion within the full-time workforce is not permitted. The military grade of the supervisor must equal or exceed the grade of personnel supervised.)

Length of Tour: Three (3) years subject to program continuance; members successfully completing initial tour will be afforded priority for tour extension, after completing initial tour. Selected individual will be required to remain in this position for 3 years.

Remarks: Previous Division, Brigade, Battalion or Squadron staff assignments desired. Completion of the Battle Staff NCO Course is desirable. Must meet OSHA standards for wearing personal protective equipment.

Additional Information: Must relocate to a commuting distance within 45 minutes from Ft Pickett, located in Blackstone, VA.

Applicants can be Army or Air Guard and will not be required to change branches.

How to Apply: Submit applications to this HQ, ATTN: VAHR-M, Building 316, Ft Pickett, Blackstone, Virginia 23824-6316, NLT 30 September 2004. Do not submit application packets in notebooks, folders, document protectors, or with any other form of binding. **No faxed applications will be accepted.**

Required documents: Applicants must submit the following documents:

1. NGB Form 34-1 (Army/Air) **(signed and dated)**
2. Copy of current physical (DD 2808/2807-1 w/in the last 5 years)
3. All documentation to support all periods of active duty service creditable for retirement. Any of the following may be used **DD Form 214 or DA 1506 or NGB Forms 23A.** (Army/Air)
4. **Certified** copy of DA Form 2-1. Certified means having the Personnel Services Branch (PSB), stamp or type that your DA Form 2-1 is a "True Copy" and a signature by PSB personnel. DA Form 2-1 (Army), or RIP (Air)
5. Copies of last five (5) NCOERs. If you are a new E-5 and have not yet received an NCOER, you may submit an letter of recommendation from your commander in lieu of the NCOER. (Army)
6. Copies of last five (5) Evaluation Reports (Air)
7. Retirement Point Accounting Management (RPAM) (Army)
8. DA Form 705 (APFT Card) (Army)
9. AF Form 526 (Point Credit Summary) (Air)
10. Photograph in Class A uniform (taken within the last 12 months). Official photo not required. Photo must be dated.
11. Any additional information the applicant may wish to submit for consideration, which enhances their skills as to working in a HAZMAT environment.

SECURITY CLEARANCE: Position requires a "SECRET" security clearance. Must be able to obtain as a minimum, an "interim" clearance **prior to appointment** to the position. If tentatively selected for a position and soldier cannot be granted an interim clearance prior to appointment to the position, and a wavier is not approved, the offer for the position may be revoked.

All qualified applicants will receive consideration for the position without discrimination for any non-merit reason(s) such as age, race, religion, gender, ethnic origin or non-disqualifying disability. Pre-selection is not only counter-productive to effective recruitment and placement, but also violates Virginia National Guard Placement principles and will not be tolerated.

Description of Duties: Responsible for sustainment training of WMD (CST) NBC Reconnaissance NCOs. Conducts physical fitness training for the survey teams and maintaining the team member of OSHA Technician Level certifications. Integrates state of the art detection and sample collection technologies into the Survey Team training schedule. Know NBC antidote administration, safe patient training schedule. Know NBC antidote administration, safe patient extraction, and crime scene/evidence preservation techniques. Participates in/monitors WMD (CST) chain of

custody (sample transfer) procedures and tracking of Survey Teams entering and existing the incident site (Hot Zone). Uses the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Guide to recommend the appropriate respiratory protection for WMD (CST) Survey Teams. Assists the Survey Team Leader in the development of an execution checklist with code words to monitor Survey Team Leader detection, identification and sample collection actions in the Hot Zone/contaminated area. Serves as the WMD (CST) Survey Team Leader in the absence of the assigned Survey Team Leader. Conducts Survey Team (mission) briefs before personnel enter an incident site including the review of all know information on the hazard, wind direction and speed, safety precautions, types of tests to be accomplished, and mission GO of NO-GO criteria. Performs all operational tasks while wearing each level of Personnel Protective Equipment (PPE). Identified TIC warning placards and NATO contamination markers - report when/where/how they are used. Crosses and marks contaminated areas. Processes through decontamination sites. Employs hand held NBC detection and identification medical/scientific analysis. Rescues and delivers any injured persons to the decontamination station. Observes and reports information on the physical layout of the incident site. Attends designated agency domestic terrorism threat briefings. Reviews draft versions of the Reconnaissance Team Standard Operating Procedures (SOP). Perform other duties as assigned.

(ARMY) Eligibility Requirements/Information for AGR Tour:

1. Must be a member or eligible to become a member of the Virginia Army National Guard. Selected individual must extend/enlist for a period equal to the AGR tour.
2. Must meet medical standards prescribed by Chapter 3, AR 40-501 and physical standards prescribed by AR 600-9.
3. If not already AGR, the individual must be eligible to complete a minimum of three (3) years in AGR status immediately prior to his/her mandatory separation date or prior to completing 18 years of Active Federal Service.
4. Individual must not be eligible for, nor receiving a federal military retired or retainer pay, nor federal service annuities.
5. Individual must possess or be able to obtain appropriate security clearance.
6. Must not be a candidate for elective office, holding a civil office (full or part-time), or engage in partisan political activities as defined by DOD Directive 5500.7, Joint Ethics Regulation.
7. Applicant selected will be subject to State Military Justice procedures/statutes and State Civil Laws/statutes, as appropriate, when serving under provisions of Title 32 U.S.C.
8. Applicant must meet other eligibility requirements for AGR service under the provisions of AR 135-18 and NGR 600-5.

(AIR) Eligibility Requirements/Information for AGR Tour

1. Must be a member of the Virginia Air National Guard.
2. Member must not have been previously separated for cause from active duty or a previous AGR tour.
3. Member must meet the physical qualifications IAW AFI 48-123. Individual must have a current physical examination within 12 months before the date of entry on AGR tour.
4. Any member on the ANG Weight Management Program is ineligible to enter AGR status. This does not include the probationary period after the loss of weight to satisfy standards. Members must meet the weight requirements at the time they are placed in the AGR program.
5. Member's military grade cannot exceed the maximum military grade authorized. Over grade member must indicate in writing, willingness to be administratively reduced in grade when assigned to the position.
6. Applicant must have been awarded the appropriate skill level and possess the announced AFSC upon selection for AGR duty. If no qualified applicants are identified, then selection may be made based on the experience and potential of those applying. In this situation, the applicant must agree to retrain following the procedures outlined in ANGI 36-101, para 3.6.
7. Must be able to serve at least 5 consecutive years in the AGR program prior to eligibility for military non-disability retirement of retainer pay.
8. Tour length will be a minimum of three years. Tours may not extend beyond an officer's MSD (Mandatory Separation Date).
9. Should be able to complete 20 years of active federal service prior to MSD for officer and age 60 for enlisted members.
10. Applicant receiving or eligible to immediately receive a federal retirement annuity and a state annuity for service as National Guard technicians are not eligible for entry on an AGR tour.
11. Must pass the Army Physical Fitness Test.
